Parenting Children Exposed in Utero

**Do you have that one case where nothing really makes sense?
Aubrey has mentored dozens of foster families with this same concern.**

Aubrey will have a conversation about how to identify symptoms due to prenatal exposure and how to pursue a diagnosis for FASD.

Most of the time will be spent talking about practical parenting strategies that are based on the neurobehavioral model. These strategies are simple and easy to implement for any child exposed in utero, but also for children with ADHD, ODD, ASD, and other neurobehavioral diagnoses. She has helped many families shift their perspective on how to become more successful.

Aubrey has been a treatment-level foster parent in Ohio for 3 years. As she started working with preteens and teens, she noticed that many of her kids had similar symptoms that were not exactly trauma. As one of her children was diagnosed with a Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder, her eyes were opened to the prevalence of the disability.

When she requested a trainer to spread the word, she found that the need for training and support was extensive. After months of training from world-leaders she now has dozens of trainings and events booked to educate the community about the most common form of developmental disabilities in America. She is also working with state and local governments
